Saint Peter said, "Always be prepared to make a defense to any one who calls on you to account for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and reverence; and keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are abused, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame." (1 Peter 3:15-16, RSV-CE). Jesus also said, "Everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 10:32-33, RSV-CE). Many of the more common questions or questions that may be asked are addressed in this booklet. If you are asked a question which is not addressed, or you don't have an immediate answer, don't make one up. Instead say, "I don't know right now but I'll find out and get back with you," then look it up or consult your priest. In any case, you can always say, "I'm Glad You Asked That!" and begin to share your faith. Questions are good. People of every age have many questions about the faith, not just what they believe and why they believe it, but about where to even start. Whether the questions are their own or are raised by others, Fr. Mark Pierce offers clear, clever, and trustworthy answers. The questions and answers are organized around
